ALEMANY FRENCH STUDENTS TACKLE POETRY

Incongruous juxtapositions and fantastic images mark the surrealistic movement of artists and writers. In their on-going exploration of French, third year students undertook the challenge of "automatic writing," a technique coined and practiced by surrealistic poets of the early 20th century. Originally viewed as, "pessimistic, defiant, and revolutionary" surrealism developed, under French poet André Breton, into a productive discovery of the unconscious process of random thoughts and dreams evolving from a dark, convoluted labyrinth of man's darkest side into a remarkable source of inspiration and creativity in later poets. "My first impression of surrealism wasn't really that great. But as I progressed with my poem, I tapped into my mind pretty well. Surrealism is beautiful and it's meaningful; the sky's the limit! There is no one to make you edit it, which makes it a hundred times better." Valerie Orijel, junior. Alemany French students focused their study on, La Fourmi (The Ant) by Robert Desnos 1900-1945 rendering their own version of his poem in order to better understand the structure and style while practicing the tradition of automatic writing. Students completed their final revision with hand drawn illustrations highlighting the visual nature of the style while portraying their own particular vocabulary. "This experience has been very different from things I have done before. It's almost like our soul was being revealed...the complete randomness of the poetry help us to feel without fear of being judged," writes junior, Danielle Grimm. Third year students are in the midst of their final performance semester and setting into motion the prewriting skills prerequisite to a successful completion of their final, formal writing assessment - an illustrated French children's story. Finally, Tanya Siddiqui shared, "This poem was very exciting because it allowed me to discover what I'm attracted to -- simple things, yet very beautiful."

Poised, gracious, and welcoming long-time Los Angeles Philharmonic New Music Composer, Steven Stucky, welcomed Los Angeles secondary schools to the annual *Symphonies for Schools* on March 6, 2009 at the Walt Disney Concert Hall conducted by Julian Kuerti. The Bishop Alemany Music Department was treated to a day of new music, the history behind the concert hall, as well as being introduced to up and coming young composers.

Many students have never been to the Disney Hall, a familiar landmark here in Los Angeles. It's really important to have that experience, I think, to be exposed to culture --a beautiful, unique building and, of course, to hear a full symphonic orchestra, shared Bishop Alemany Music Director, Jennifer Bellusci, under whose direction the BAHS Orchestra would later take First Prize and Second in the Band Division at the Heritage Music Festival in San Diego after their inspired visit to the concert hall.

The day began with a cordial introduction to the Hall by volunteers who greeted the students and set the scene for the upcoming high-seas musical adventure and mixed metaphor. Along with Musical Director, Jennifer Bellusci, BAHS Vocal Instructor and Choir Director, Juanita Chauvin and several parent/teacher volun-

teers enjoyed a day unlike any other. Master of Ceremonies, Steven Stucky, introduced the audience to the story behind the concert hall's unique façade and interior design sharing architect, Franck Gehry's vision for the hall taking his sculptural cues from the inspiration of Lillian Disney whose particular aesthetic leanings he fluidly incorporated into both the physical space and the garden. The Disney Hall is a beautiful and modern masterpiece. I was in awe when I saw the Hall in all it's glory, says Angela Hernandez, Second Violin/Second Soprano. The concert hall is like a rose unfolding and the construction inside made everything sound amazing, added fellow Second Soprano, Jeanneen Matias.

A native of Canada, Gehry fashioned a functional acoustic art form of converging steel plates and incorporated the contrarian element of wood throughout the Hall. An avid lover of sailing, Gehry is know for having said, "Architecture is Music frozen in time." Taking an unexpected turn of steel seamlessly flowing into steel, the hall's interior is reminiscent of the hull of a cutter with its depth of keel. Creating the visual effect of strength, warmth, and portraying the watery insight of Gehry's vision, the ocean waves contribute to the aura that lends itself to the Hall being a dynamic and living life form in and of itself.

This year the L.A. Phil sponsored several young composers and provided a venue for their compositions through the Second Annual Young Composers Fellowship Program which the Symphonies for Schools program highlights. Aspiring Fellow, young composer and Bishop Alemany pianist, Chris Runyon, remarked that they were surprisingly young to be making some really great music....they were really smart -- they actually symbolized the music of the building. The 2009 Fellows were: Andy Alden and Jack McFadden-Talbot of Harvard-Westlake, Tim Callobre of Pasadena Polytechnic, and Saad Haddad of North Hollywood High who shared their personal interpretations of the material form into the conceptual and aural depictions of the Walt Disney Concert Hall. A challenge which outgoing and long-time L.A. Philharmonic Music Director, Esa-Pekka Salonen, himself also undertook to much acclaim. The audience enjoyed each composition along with several video cuts from the composers' initial impressions of the Hall and personal experience of creating an original composition. Bishop Alemany Concertmaster and winner of the Adjudicator Trophy for Outstanding Soloist, Alexandra Cabal, said her favorite young composer was Tim from Polytechnic. His composition, I thought, captured the ocean metaphor. It inspired me...it was a different point of view. Finally, Music Director, Jennifer Bellusci summarized the experience by adding that getting chills... to open minds and hearts to Music, to see finally, that there are other forms of music which can be equally exciting and moving ... is my hope for all students. by N.R. SUMMER SCHOOL

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SUMMER SCHOOL REGULATIONS - 2009



All classes will meet four days a week for six weeks with the exception of the Readak class and SAT Preparation.



All classes will be in session from June 17 through July 28, 2009 unless noted otherwise.

REGISTRATION: Early registration will take place in May in the Counseling Center during nutrition and lunch. You may mail the registration form and payment to Summer School Office until June 2nd at 11111 North Alemany Drive, Mission Hills, CA, 91345. Final regular Registration will take place on Monday, June 15th, 2009, and Tuesday, June 16th, 2009 from 8:00 a.m. to 12 p.m. on the West Campus. Tuition for summer school must be paid in full by this date. Students must present a SUMMER SCHOOL AGREEMENT form signed by a parent and the student when registering. N.B.: This form must be read well before signing. Keep the book copy of the contract for your records.

NON-ALEMANY students must have an additional form filled out by their home school. This form can be found on line at alemany.org. In addition, non-Alemany students will be charged a \$75 non-refundable registration fee.

LATE REGISTRATION: Students may register late Wednesday, June 17th from 9:00 am to Noon. A late registration fee of \$15.00 may be charged.

Parents need not accompany students for registration. Those wishing to avoid waiting in long lines on the last day may register by mail. Those who register by mail do not have to come on registration day. They merely report to their class on the first day of summer school. No mail registrations will be accepted if postmarked after June 2nd .

TUITION: Tuition for a ½-unit (0.5) course is \$200. Developmental/Reading and Study Skills class are TBD. SAT Prep is \$240. Checks should be made out to Alemany Summer School. Please put SS and student name in the memo area of your check.

<u>WITHDRAWAL POLICY</u>: A full refund will be given if Bishop Alemany High School must cancel class due to nonsufficient enrollment or other staffing issues. Since the annual summer school budget, the hiring of teachers and staff, and the purchase of supplies are based upon the numbers of students attending summer school, if a student withdraws for any reason, any tuition or fees will be forfeit and not refunded.

<u>ATTENDANCE:</u> Students who are absent more than three (3) days from any class will not be considered as having fulfilled their summer school requirement. Every three (3) tardies to the same class will be treated as a day's absence from that class. THERE ARE NO EXCUSED ABSENCES FOR SUMMER CLASSES.

FOR THOSE WHO REGISTER EARLY, SCHEDULES WILL BE MAILED THE WEEK PRIOR TO THE BEGINNING OF SUMMER SCHOOL. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE YOUR SCHEDULE BY MAIL, IT WILL BE AVAILABLE IN THE SUMMER SCHOOL OFFICE ON THE FIRST DAY OF SUMMER SESSION.

<u>**REQUEST FOR SPECIFIC CLASS TIME:**</u> Must be submitted in writing by June 2nd. Every effort will be made to honor such requests whenever possible. No refunds will be given for students who withdraw because of class scheduling.

IMPORTANT: Any course failed during this present semester must also be made up this summer. However, school policy requires any student who accumulates three (3) or more failing grades during the same school year to withdraw from Alemany.



FINAL EXAMS:

All final exams will be given on July 28, 2009. There will be no exceptions.

CLASSES RAISE 3K FOR RICE BOWL COLLECTION
