## Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up

All students must be dropped off and picked up in the designated areas ON CAMPUS.

Students must never:

- Be dropped off or picked up ANYWHERE off campus (including San Fernando Mission Blvd., Noble Ave., Alexander St., Sharp Ave., etc.)
- Be dropped off or picked up in the west faculty parking lot (in the circle drive or in front of the Administration building.)

The school recommends that parents arrive at least 15 minutes before the start of school to help minimize delays and avoid tardies for the student.

**Shorts/Pants:**

- **Girls are NO LONGER allowed to wear skirts.**
- Girls...Khaki Pants style #: KR715KH or KR711KH. Khaki Shorts style #: KR714KH or KR711KKH.
- Boys...Khaki Pants style #: WP673KH or 17262KH. Khaki Shorts style #: 12274KH 18" inseam, 57562KH, or 27262KH.

**Shirts**

- Shirts must be white or cardinal with the Alemany logo
- Approved athletic team and club polo shirts may also be worn
- Short sleeve polo shirts are to be worn at all times! This includes under school sweatshirts and jackets.

## Dress Code (cont.)

**Sweatshirts/Pullover Jackets/Sweaters**

- Only approved Bishop Alemany sweatshirts, pullover jackets or sweaters worn over an Alemany polo are acceptable.

**Shoes**

- Shoes are to cover the entire foot. No open toe/heel shoes are allowed. Socks must be worn. Stockings must cover the foot. No footless tights or leggings. Solid colored tights in white, black or gray are allowed.

**Jackets**

- The only acceptable jackets are school jackets sold in the Bishop Alemany Bookstore and solid color heavy winter jackets or rain jackets that have no wording or insignia.

## Use of Electronic Devices

Cell phones and other electronic devices (including, ipods, cameras, etc.) may not be seen or heard during school hours.

- Items will be confiscated and may only be picked up by a parent or guardian. All confiscated items are subject to search by the Administration.
- Students will also receive a 1-hour Saturday detention.

B.A.H.S. is not responsible for theft of or damage to personal property, including but not limited to textbooks and electronic devices.

## Lockers

Students may only use their assigned locker and are responsible for keeping them in good condition. Bishop Alemany reserves the right to search lockers at any time. Students are responsible for all items found in their assigned lockers.

- Lockers may be used before school, during nutrition, the first and last ten minutes of lunch and after school only.
- All students must purchase and use an official Bishop Alemany lock from the Bishop Alemany bookstore. All unauthorized locks will be cut off.

## Student ID's

Students are expected to carry their BAHS school IDs at all times.

- If a student loses their student ID, they should contact the Dean's Office immediately.

## Tardies

Students are automatically assigned one hour of detention for the following Saturday for each tardy.

## Absences

**Procedure**

- Parents must notify the Attendance Office before 8:00 am if a student will be absent (x. 5202)
- When the student returns to school, he/she **must** bring a written note, signed by the parent/guardian explaining the reason for the absence, to the Attendance Office.

**Excessive Absences:** If students miss more than 12 class sessions in one semester, they are considered excessively absent and will be in immediate danger of losing academic credit.

## Athletic Department Philosophy

## Required Paperwork & Procedures

All athletes must have on file with the Athletic Department the following paperwork before participating in a sport:

1. A current physical examination
2. Emergency Card
3. Medical History Form
4. Parent/Athlete Commitment Form
5. Parent Release Form
6. Code of Ethics for Alemany Athletes
7. Athletic Hazing Policy Form
8. Transportation Release Form

## Academic Eligibility

Students must maintain a GPA of 2.0 to participate in activities and athletics. Eligibility is based on the previous quarter's performance.

- If a student falls below a 2.0 GPA in any quarter, he/she is automatically placed on probation for the next quarter.
- If at the end of the next quarter the student's grades are still below a 2.0 GPA, the student is declared ineligible for the entire quarter.
- Ineligibility begins on the day that progress reports are distributed.
